# FOUR-FACTOR ANALYSIS FOR LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY PERSONS

### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

**TOWN OF SNEADS** 

**Purpose**: In compliance with Executive Order 13166, the Town of Sneads has developed the following Four Factor Analysis for Limited English Proficiency (LEP) persons.

**History**: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 is the federal law that protects individuals from discrimination on the basis of their race, color, or national origin in programs that receive federal financial assistance. In certain situations, failure to ensure that persons who have limited English proficiency can effectively participate in, or benefit from, federally assisted programs may violate Title VI's prohibition against national origin discrimination.

Persons who, as a result of national origin, do not speak English as their primary language and who have limited ability to speak, read, write, or understand English may be entitled to language assistance under Title VI in order to receive a particular service, benefit, or encounter.

**Town of Sneads Four-Factor Analysis**: The following Four-Factor Analysis will serve as the guide for determining which language assistance measures the Town of Sneads will undertake to guarantee access to Town Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) programs by LEP persons.

 Number or proportion of LEP persons served or encountered in the eligible service population (served or encountered includes those persons who would be served by the recipient if the person received education and outreach and the recipient provided sufficient language services).

The Town of Sneads utilized American Community Survey data Table DP02. Based on this data, Jackson County does not meet the 1,000 or 5% LEP persons threshold for Spanish, Asian/Pacific Islander, or any other Non-English speakers.

2. The frequency with which the LEP persons come into contact with the program.

The proposed project is an infrastructure project that does not provide direct assistance to individuals. As a result, LEP persons rarely come into contact with the CDBG program. However, all citizen participation activities are open to the general public.

3. The nature and importance of the program, activity, or service provided by the program.

The proposed project does not provide direct assistance to individuals. As a result, LEP persons rarely come into contact with the CDBG program. However, all citizen participation activities are open to the general public.

4. The resources available and costs to the recipient.

Currently, there are free websites that can be utilized to translate some written materials. Additionally, local volunteers have been identified to provide oral translation services at public meetings and during conversations with LEP residents during the implementation of the proposed project. Furthermore, many of the common forms used in the implementation of a CDBG project are available in multiple languages on the HUD and DOL websites. Additionally, translation activities are an eligible CDBG administrative expense. Therefore, limited LAP measures are reasonable given the resources available to the Town.

Once the Four-Factor Analysis has been completed, the community must determine if a LAP is required.

If the community determines that a LAP is **not** required, then the certification below should be signed and dated by the chief elected official and the Four-Factor Analysis should be kept in the Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity CDBG program file.

If the Four-Factor Analysis identifies a LEP threshold population and/or if the nature of the program activities is such that a LAP is triggered, please delete the certification below and complete the LAP section at the end of this sample document.

**Certification:** Based on the above Four-Factor Analysis, the Town of Sneads is not required to develop a LAP. However, the Town will make all reasonable attempts to accommodate language access needs of residents <u>requesting</u> oral translation during citizen participation activities.

**WHEREAS**, the Town has identified the following priority project for submission under the CDBG-CV Program:

### Town of Sneads Health & Recreation Renewal Project

The project will include the repair/replacement of overhead lighting at the Town's recreational fields and only open-air community gathering area; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant program requires a public hearing be held and the project be approved and adopted by the Town Council.

WHEREAS, the Town Council Vice President and/or the Town Manager have authority and rights to execute all required grant related application and agreement documents in the absence of the Town Council President, including acting as a Certifying Officer under Section 104(g) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C. 5304 (g)) (HUD Act), in connection with the receipt if assistance from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the HUD Act (or refer to specific assistance from HUD). Such authority hereby delegated includes, but is not limited to, the authority to execute the certification required under Section 104 (g) of the HUD Act; the authority to specify when appropriate that the jurisdiction has fully carried out its responsibilities for environmental review, decision making and action under Section 104(g) (1) of the HUD Act; the authority to consent to assume the status of a responsible Federal Official under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and other provisions of law specified in the regulations of HUD in 24 CFR Part 58;

### MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 26, 2021, 6:00 PM CST

A special meeting of the Town Council of Sneads, Florida was called to order at 6:00 PM, Tuesday, October 26, 2021, by Council President Mike Weeks. Members present were Councilmembers Donovan Weeks, Anthony Money, and George Alexander

Council President Weeks stated the purpose of the special meeting and public hearing was to obtain comments from the public regarding pending application for a CDBG-CV for lightening at the Sports Complex. He called on Mr. Vance Coley, Melvin Engineers to commence the public hearing at 6:01 PM. Mr. Coley went into detail the grant parameters and how we produced this project to apply for. There was one comment from the public present regarding the possibility of obtaining more protective equipment/supplies for COVID-19 for the public safety departments. This was taken into consideration and after a response from the Police Chief, stating that adequate equipment and supplies were on hand from the CARES Act Funding, the gentleman stated he had no further comments and agreed with the project for which an application was being submitted, that was to assist with getting lights at the sports complex for children and others to have a place to gather, as the sports complex is the only place in the Town large enough for such assemblies. Mr. Coley also explained the Four-Factor Analysis for limited English Proficiency persons, which needed to be approved by the council, along with the Resolution authorizing submission of the application. Council President Weeks then adjourned the public hearing at 6:06 and opened the special meeting of council.

A motion was made by Councilman Money, seconded by Councilman Alexander to approve the Four-Factor Analysis and the motion carried by a 4-0 vote for approval.
