WHEREAS, the Town of Sneads plans to apply to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) for funds to cover the local match portion of HMGP funding recently awarded by the Florida Division of Emergency Management and FEMA.

Executive Summary

I-10 Interchange Utility Extension

The proposed utility extension routes encompass the area north from I-10 Interchange along C.R. 286 to the current Town of Sneads limits. The water main extension route falls within this project area and runs primarily along the west side of C.R. 286. Included with the proposed water main extension analysis are also sites along C.R. 286 that were evaluated for an elevated water tank and public well to supply the proposed water main. The sewer force main extension also runs north from I-10 along the east side of C.R. 286 until reaching Sinai Road. The sewer force main turns and runs east and then south along Sinai Road before being routed through ACI/TIIFT property over to Ham Pond Road and then north to the Sneads Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Two lift stations are recommended to transport the sewage generated at the interchange to Sneads WWTP. Lift Station "A" is located at the north side corner of C.R. 286 and Homefront Road. The site will require acquisition of a 55-foot by 40-foot area with driveway access from C.R. 286 that is owned by Randall Tyre. The proposed lift station will discharge into Lift Station "B". Lift Station "B" is located at the south side corner of C.R. 286 and Sinai Road. The site will require acquisition of a 60-foot by 40-foot area with driveway access from Sinai Road that is owned by C&E Farm. The proposed lift station will discharge into Sneads WWTP.

The analysis of three elevated water tower sites were conducted for this report. Site Option 1 is located about 1.80 miles north of the I-10 interchange near C.R. 286 and is owned by Janet Havrilla. The 2-acre site is an undeveloped, naturally wooded area with a ground elevation of approximately 171 feet. The current land use for this property is Agriculture 2 which does allow public water facilities. Site Option 2 is located about 1.65 miles north of the I-10 interchange near C.R. 286 and is owned by Lewis and Karen Johnson. The 2-acre site is being used for agriculture and has a ground elevation of 171 feet. The current land use for this property is also Agriculture 2. Site Option 3 is located about 2.55 miles north of the I-10 interchange near Hill Farm Road and is owned by the ACI/TIIFT. The 2-acre site is a viable option in the event that the property owners of Site Option 1 and Site Option 2 are not willing to sell their property.

It is proposed to divide this project into two phases. *Phase I* will ensure that water and sewer service is available at the I-10 interchange. *Phase I* construction consists of an elevated water tank, public well, water distribution system to the I-10 interchange, two lift stations, and sewage force main from the I-10 interchange to Sneads WWTP. Phase II construction consists of extending the water main from the elevated water tower to the Town's existing water distribution system.

The estimated construction costs of Phase I is \$6.90 million and Phase II is \$2.45 million. The total anticipated cost of the project is \$9.35 million.

River Road Utility Extension Study

River Road is located on the west side of Sneads. Approximately 0.90 miles north of its intersection with US 90 is Sale Street. Located there is an existing residential subdivision on the west side of River Road. There are three additional primary internal roadways located in the subdivision, which are all unpaved, that consist of Suellen Street, Paula Street, and Gerald Avenue. The subdivision is comprised of an estimated 31 homes.



The existing ground in the subdivision slopes west and northwest toward the cul-de-sac located at the west end of Sale Street. The Town of Sneads owns a ± 0.30 acre parcel on the south side of the cul-de-sac where a ± 0.10 acre stormwater retention area is located. Based on the topography and the Town's ownership of this parcel, it is the recommended location for the master pump station with a minimum footprint of 30-feet by 30-feet. From this site, a 6" sewer force main is proposed to be routed east along the south side of Sale Street, which is public right-of-way, to River Road and then south to connect to the gravity manhole at Beauchamp Lane.

The internal sewer collection system for the Sale Street subdivision will consist of 8" gravity sewer main and associated manholes. The most economical approach is to have the proposed gravity sewer main follow the existing ground slope with flow going from east to west. Along Sale Street, the proposed 8" gravity sewer main is located in the middle of the south lane of the existing paved roadway and flows west toward the proposed master lift station at the cul-de-sac. On Suellen Street and Paula Street, the proposed 8" gravity sewer main is located in the center of the unpaved roadways and flows west toward the hayfield. The recommended route is to extend the gravity sewer into the hayfield and obtain a 100-foot utility easement along its east boundary. This option will enable the construction of the 8" gravity sewer needed to collect the flows from Suellen Street and Paula Street and route it north to the proposed master lift station without having to go through any existing residential lots.

The anticipated cost of the project is \$1.51 million.

Natural Gas Extension Study

The purpose of this portion of the preliminary engineering report is to provide a review of a potential extension of the existing gas main serving ACI to the Town of Sneads. ACI is currently supplied via a 4" steel coated natural gas distribution line located approximately operated by Central Florida Gast. The line is located along Gulf Power Road approximately 4000-feet from the eastern boundary of the town limits. The distribution line currently operates at 150 PSI and is capable of supplying approximately 35,000 cubic feet per hour. Modifications to the meter and regulations at the gate station could increase the supply in the 4" distribution line to 50,000 – 60,000 cubic feet per hour. In addition, a pressure increase in the system would also allow for additional capacity.


The potential routing for the natural gas main extension has been categorized into three alternatives. The Base Alternative includes the expansion of the gas main from the existing 4" line at Gulf Power Road to the town's limits in the vicinity of Ham Pond Road.


The anticipated costs associated with the Base Alternative (Gulf Power Rd to Ham Pond Rd) alternative are \$990,300.00.


The further extension of the natural gas main was evaluated, and two alternative routes were developed. Alternative #1 would continue to route the natural gas main along US 90 through Sneads to the Town's western boundary. Alternative #2 would route the natural gas main down Old Spanish Trail to the town's western boundary. Alternative #1 is the recommended route since it is along the primary commercial corridor and allows for the greatest flexibility in future expansions to north and west sides of town. In addition, Alternative #1 provides the preferred route for extension of natural gas service to the proposed school facility site on the west side of town.


The anticipated costs associated with Alternative #1 (Expansion along US 90) is \$2.16 million.
